DISCUSSION TOPICS:

Discussion Topic #2: Unity Subcommittee: Over the history of the Area, between Activities and dances their treasury consistently loses money. However, the annual fundraiser does not provide a replenishment to their account, which is already more than the Area's. WHAT CAN WE DO? The 11th concept specifically states prudent use – not spending frivolously or self-indulgently, with clear spending priorities. Chris W.

She has only typed the minutes three times out of the last seven months and those three months were either last minute or never received by the home groups. The vice secretary has been doing the minutes, including typing and mailing, yet had not been reimbursed timely due to secretary receiving month funds. The vice secretary can no longer foot the bill. 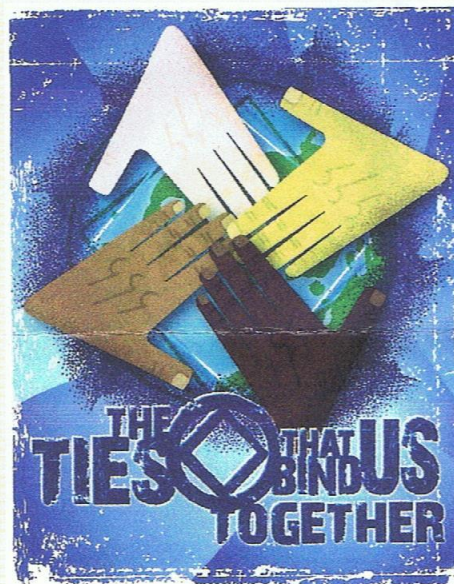

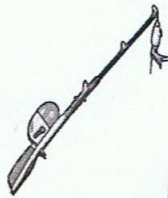

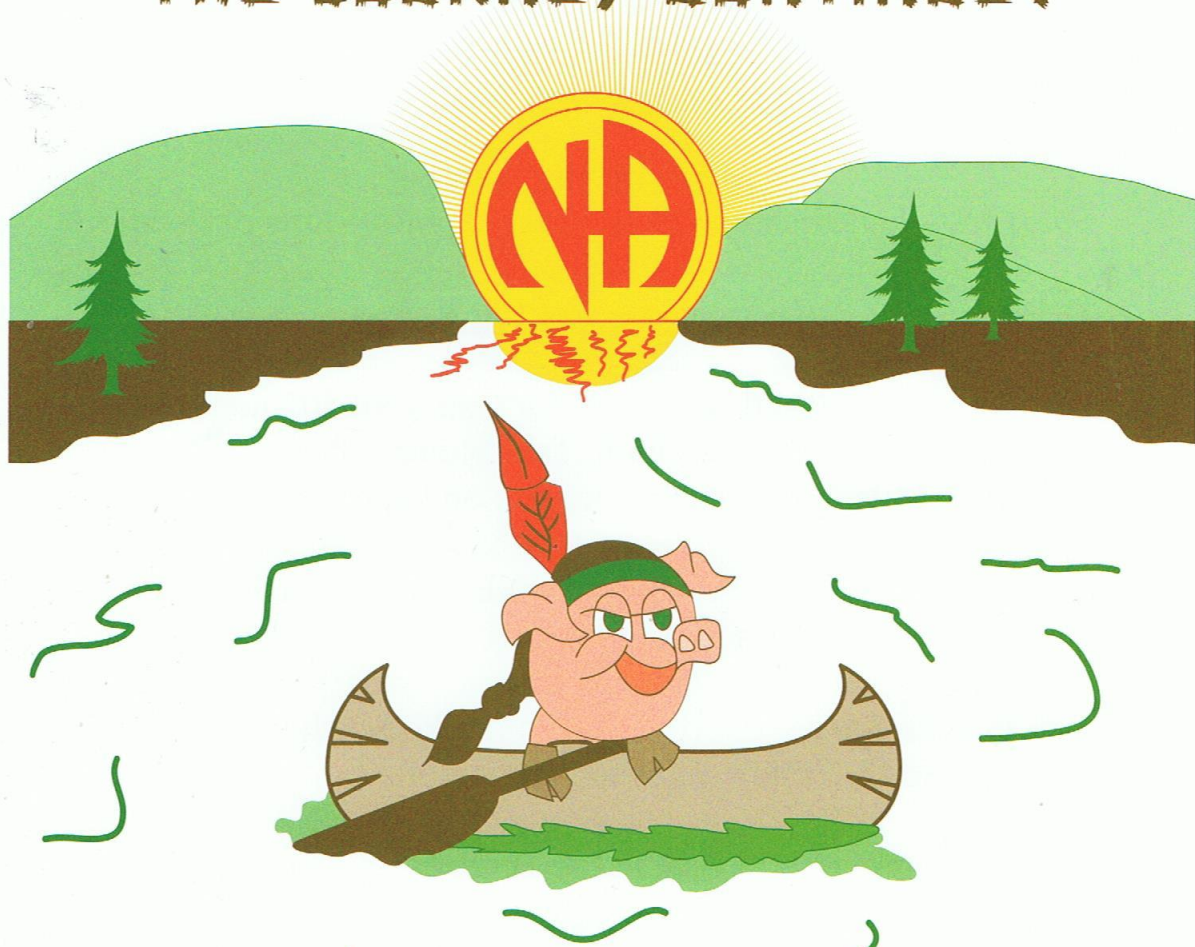
